Focus

Developing foundational skills in creativity, observation, and artistic techniques.

Introduction

Our Year 7 curriculum aims to build on prior achieved skills from Key Stage 2. Our aim is to help students develop a well-rounded understanding of art and its history. We want students to learn about different artists and designers, experiment with various techniques and materials, and develop their own unique artistic style.

Key Topics:

1. Self-image:

- Explore personal identity and self-expression through art.
- Use a variety of techniques to create self-portraits, including drawing, painting, and mixed media.

- Reflect on the role of art in preserving and celebrating natural beauty.

4. Objects and viewpoints:

- Use shading and perspective to create depth and realism in drawings.
- Experiment with different types of objects and subjects, such as still life, portraits, and abstract forms.
- Consider the role of composition and framing in conveying meaning and emotion in artwork.

Learning Objectives:
